## SPEAKER BIOS

### **Curtis M. Loftis, Jr. South Carolina State Treasurer**

The Honorable Curtis M. Loftis, Jr. is the State Treasurer of South Carolina, the Chairman of the Board of Financial Institutions and a member of the South Carolina Investment Commission. He is a determined advocate for government transparency and accountability, especially in his role as custodian of the state's funds. Treasurer Loftis is the "private banker" for South Carolina, responsible for the investment, cash management and safekeeping of the State's general and restricted funds and the assets of the South Carolina Retirement Systems.

Mr. Loftis began his public service career in 2007, serving as the Director of The Office on Aging. In 2008, Loftis served as the Director of Transparency in the Comptroller General's Office. Prior to his time in public service, Mr. Loftis spent 25 years running a successful business which currently operates in Central and Coastal South Carolina. He is also the founder and sole benefactor of The Saluda Charitable Foundation, which focuses its giving on the education, nutrition and medical care of children, especially those with disabilities.



Loftis was born in Columbia and graduated from the University of South Carolina. He currently resides in West Columbia.
